


# MORE BOOKS ADDED THROUGH PURCHASES AND DONATIONS

# Franklin County Quilters Guild Quilt Show

St. Albans, VT - The Franklin County Quilters Guild is hosting its 18th annual Franklin County Quilt Show on Saturday, April 2nd and Sunday, April 3rd at St. Mary's Parish Hall. This is a new location for this year only. St. Mary's Parish Hall is located at 36 Fairfield Street, St. Albans, VT.

This event is FREE and open to the public. The FREE admission gives show attendees a chance to win a beautiful door prize basket filled with items such as local maple syrup, lotions, tea, coffee, and other choice items. On Saturday, the quilt show hours are 9:00 am to 4:00 pm; Sunday's quilt show hours are 10:00 am to 3:00 pm.

St. Mary's Parish Hall will be decorated with over 100 quilts on display at the Franklin County Quilters Show. There will be a variety of quilt sizes (large bed quilts to tiny miniatures) and a variety of quilt styles (traditional, modern, pictorial). Also, there will be a special display of wallhangings to commemorate the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the guild's establishment. Throughout the weekend, guild members and vendors will provide demonstrations of various quilting techniques. The quilt show activities culminate at the awards ceremony on Sunday afternoon for the viewer's choice awards, the Mayor's award, the raffle drawing for a queen-size quilt, and other special prizes.

The Franklin County Quilters Guild is the largest quilt guild in Franklin County, Vermont with just under 100 members. The guild formed in 1991 to promote an interest in the art of quilting for guild members and for the community and has met monthly ever since. Franklin County Quilters Guild has donated over 1000 quilts to charities and individuals since its inception. Monthly meetings are held on the third Wednesday, September through June, at the Church of the Rock on Route 104 in St. Albans, starting at 7:00 p.m.
