



FEATURED THIS MONTH: BOOKS FOR MAKING BABY QUILTS

The guild library has several books for making baby quilts. You'll find a quick description of those books below. The librarian will bring the featured books to the April guild meeting so members can look through the books; she will also bring the books on scrap quilts, which were featured in the January newsletter, to the April meeting too.

Baby Quilts with Love by Alex Anderson: At least half of the dozen projects in the book listed are suitable for beginners. Anderson gives good advice about color choices (i.e. choose a focus fabric and then pick accompanying colors). Even a beginner should be able to whip through one of these projects in a weekend, maybe two. The book includes 12 projects in all.

<u>Jack and Jill Quilts</u> by Retta Warehime: Eight separate patterns are presented with a boy's version and a girl's versions. The projects range from cowboy and cowgirl quilts to airplanes and butterflies.

<u>Knit a Dozen Baby Socks</u> by Edie Eckman: Although not a quilting book, there are a lot of knitters in the guild who might enjoy this book. The patterns in this book are sized for 6 months to 24 months. The instructions are easy to follow.

<u>Quilts for Baby: Easy as ABC</u> by Ursula Reikes: This book triumphs in providing excellent patterns that are stimulating for the beginning quilter. It also demonstrates how to incorporate children's novelty fabrics into traditional blocks. It marries the traditional patterns of quilting with the new colors and fabrics available today. The directions are clearly written with illustrations that anyone walking off the street could use to successfully accomplish making a very pleasing baby quilt.

More Quilts for Baby: Easy as ABC by Ursula Reikes: This is as good, if not better, than the author's first book, Quilts for Baby, Easy as ABC. This book has more quick and easy patterns in wonderful colorful fabrics. And they make great quilts for other family members too, not just babies...just add a few more blocks to make them larger.

<u>The Bib Boutique</u> by Jennifer Gierke: The book includes 24 patterns for two bib sizes. The designs include both seasonal ones and ones for every day.

12 IN 2012 UFO CHALLENGE

The 12 in 2012 UFO Challenge is generating a lot of excitement in the guild. For those members who missed the January meeting, Sharon Perry introduced a new challenge to guild members to finish some UnFinished prOjects (UFO), 12 to be exact...12 in 2012.

To participate, you'll need to find all your UFOs and decide which ones you want to finish this year. Fill out the entry form which can be found online at http://www.commonthreadsvt.org/12in12ufo.pdf and bring it to the February meeting. You also need to bring two fat quarters as an entry fee to join the challenge. For those members who receive the newsletter in the mail, Sharon will have additional entry forms at the February meeting. Just be sure to bring a completed UFO to show in February and your list of UFOs so you can fill out the form at the meeting.

Every month, from February to December, you must bring at least one completed project and show it during Show and Tell so Sharon can take a picture. The 12th completed project can be finished and shown anytime during 2012...it's your choice.

For every month you bring a completed project on your UFO list, you'll enter your name <u>twice</u> for the monthly drawing. In December, every guild member who has "met the challenge" and completed 12 UFOs in 2012 (on time) by December will get to enter a special drawing for a "fabulous" grand prize.

After hearing all the discussion and excitement about the challenge, here are a few qualifiers.

- If you're fortunate enough <u>not</u> to have 12 UFOs collecting dust, then decide on 12 projects you'd like to complete this year and bring a finished project every month, plus one additional anytime during the year, for Show and Tell.
- If you have more than 12 UFOs you'd like to complete, fill out as many entry forms as you need. For every UFO completed above and beyond your 12 in 2012 UFOs, you can enter your name **once** for the monthly drawing. As a note, each member only has to provide two fat quarters to enter no matter how many entry forms you fill out.
- If you happen to miss a meeting (or several because you "snow bird" in a warmer climate), your completed projects will be considered finished "on time" as long as you bring all to the next meeting you attend. As an example, if you miss the March meeting, you must bring two completed UFOs to the April meeting (one for March and one for April). Or if you miss the February, March and April meetings, you must bring 4 completed UFOs to the May meeting.

As a final point, this challenge is all about completing some of those unfinished projects you have "cluttering" your sewing room and having fun along the way. So go clean out your sewing room and pull out all your UFOs...you just might be surprised how many you find. There will be a special prize for the member who finds the most UFOs!
