# Message from the President


That groundhog was right on February 2! However, we, as quilters, have no problem with having to stay inside during a snowstorm. Happily we quilt!

**Sunshine Quilts**: Marion Seasholtz reported that three lap quilts were given to families with needs. There was a fire recently in Johnson. Some quilts will go there. Another group in Hyde Park also gives quilts to fire victims.

**Copley Hospital** is asking for quilts for door prizes in connection with their celebration of 25 years of midwifery. No money would be involved. Lap quilts or baby quilts? More information is needed. We will vote on the request in April.

### **ARROWS**

### **Cutting**

U-Cream-Cut 1—4 **W** square


V-Cream -Cut-4—1 ½ X 4 ½" rectangles


W-Green-Cut—8—1 ½ X 4 ½" rectangles

X-Cream-Cut – 2—4 ¼" squares—Cut on both diagonals for 8 X triangles

Y-Green-Cut 2-4 1/4" squares —Cut on both diagonals for 8 Y triangles

- 1) Sew W-Green- strips to V Cream Strips-with cream in middle-make 4
- 2) Sew X-Cream triangles to Y-Green-triangles on short sides to make 4 X Y triangles
- 3) Sew each XY triangle to another XY triangle to make 4XY squares
- 4) Sew 1 X Y square to each side of a W V square make 2
- 5) Sew 1 W V square to each side of U square
- 6) Sew V W X Y strips to top and bottom of V W U strip
- 7) Make sure that the arrow pattern goes around the outside of the square

### 19<sup>th</sup> Annual Spring Has Sprung Quilt Show

St. Albans, VT - The Franklin County Quilters Guild hosts its 19<sup>th</sup> annual Franklin County Quilt Show on Saturday, April 1st, and Sunday, April 2nd, 2017 at Saint Albans City Hall, 100 North Main Street. This event is FREE and open to the public. The FREE admission gives show attendees a chance to win a beautiful door prize basket filled with items such as local maple syrup, candles, and much, much more. On Saturday, the quilt show hours are 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. while on Sunday the quilt show will be open from 10:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m.

The Saint Albans City Hall will be filled with over 100 quilts that will be on display at the Franklin County Quilt Show in the City Hall gymnasium. In addition to viewing the many quilts, show attendees can take a chance on beautifully handcrafted quilts at the guild's teacup auction or on the guild's raffle quilt. Viewers can also shop at vendor booths featuring quilt-related items such as fabric or sewing notions

Throughout the day, guild members and vendors will provide demonstrations of various quilting techniques. There will also be special displays of the guild's many charitable endeavors such as Purple Heart Quilts, Breast Cancer Quilts, and the 2017 Charity Quilt for the Sheldon Historical Society. The guild has donated over 1000 quilts to charities and individuals since 1991. The quilt show activities culminate at the awards ceremony on Sunday afternoon for the viewers' choice awards and the Mayor's award and the raffle drawing for a queen-size quilt and other great prizes.

With just under 100 members, the Franklin County Quilters Guild has grown to be the largest quilt guild in Franklin County. The guild was established to promote an interest in the art of quilting for guild members and for the community and has met monthly ever since. Monthly meetings are held on the third Wednesday, September through June, at the Church of the Rock on Route 104, starting at 6:30 pm.

Come see the many quilts on display in Saint Albans on Saturday, April 1<sup>st</sup>, and Sunday, April 2<sup>nd</sup>, and enjoy the time-honored tradition of quilt making.
