






1	Background fabric 1 Cut 6 squares 2 <sup>7</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " and bisect on one diagonal
2	Fabric 2 Cut 2 squares 2 <sup>7</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " and bisect on one diagonal
3	Fabric 3 Cut 4 squares 2 %" and bisect on one diagonal
4	Fabric 4 Cut 4 squares 2 %" and bisect on one diagonal
