

Food Shelf Items Needed

Whole-wheat flour Quick Bread or Muffin Mix , Toothpaste, Spaghetti Sauce, Shampoo

Shredded Wheat Barley, Noodle soups, pancake mixes, Bisquick, canned veggies

Cream of Wheat Mustard / Ketchup and Mustard

Cornmeal Granola

Pretzels Pancake Mix

Dried Milk Biscuit Mix

Crackers Rice Pilaf

100% Juices Raisins or Peanuts

Baby Food Canned Tomatoes

Casserole Tote

Materials:

2/3 yard main fabric
2/3 yard lining fabric
Heavy cotton batting, cut 12" x 59"
Matching thread

Notions:


1/2 "wooden dowels, two, each 16" long
Edge stitching foot -- if you have one
Pictogram pen or Chaco liner or fabric marker
Dual feed foot -- if you have one
Quilting guide that comes with walking foot
Round corner ruler -- if you have one
Rotary cutter
Rulers
Pins
Needles
General sewing supplies

Cut:

Strips for bow: 3 1/4"x12"


Body:

Put main fabric and lining right sides together, and cut both 28"x12".
Round corners



Handles:

Cut both pieces 30"x12"
Fold handles in half and cut 4"x4" square as shown



Batting:

Cut 1 28"x12" & round corners
Cut 1 30"x12" with square cutouts



Sew:

1. Put lining pieces (right sides up) on batting pieces.
2. Mark quilting lines or attach quilting guide.
