Half Log Cabin

For each block cut 1 3/4" strips of light or off-white and 4 different blues.

Sew the light to the lightest of the blues (Blue 1). Cut into 1 3/4" wide pieces ('A')

Sew the 'A's to the Blue 2 strip and cut apart to make 'B'

Sew the 'B's to a strip of white and cut apart to make 'C'

Sew the 'C's to the Blue 3 strip and cut apart to make 'D'

Sew the 'D's to a strip of white and cut apart to make 'E'

Sew the 'E's to the Blue 4 strip and cut apart to make 'F'

Sew the 'F's together to make the block
